Travel information

Train

Central Station is 100 meters away on Queen Street. St David's Station is a 15 minute walk or short bus or taxi ride away.

Bus and coach

Most city buses stop in the High Street or Queen Street. The nearest drop-off point for coaches is in Queen Street outside Central station.

Car

Use city centre parking: Guildhall Shopping Centre, Harlequins Shopping Centre and Mary Arches car parks are nearby. Visit the City Council's website for information on all Exeter car parks.

There are two parking spaces for blue badge holders at the Museum's garden entrance, accessed via Upper Paul Street which runs beside the Museum from Queen Street. These spaces can only be used by permit holders; call 01392 265960 during opening hours to book your free temporary permit. Wheelchair users and people with mobility scooters, pushchairs and buggies should use the ramp at the garden entrance or the lifting platform at the Queen Street entrance.

Park and Ride bus services stop in Paris Street or South Street.

Parking for motorists with disabilities is free in Exeter City Council car parks (except Guildhall and Mary Arches), provided a valid blue badge is displayed. Wide parking bays are available for disabled motorists in most car parks.
